


Blue Stephenson Cemetery



Near the center of NW ¼ of Sw ¼ of Sec. 14, T52N R8W. North of Mexico on StRd J to StRd O, north on StRd O to gravel driveway on the right. Permission needed for access. Cemetery is in a meadow, unfenced, and is mowed occasionally. In the past, livestock have pastured here and most stones are down. Compiled by Gene Gallagher in 1975, revisited in 1991 by members of the Audrain County Area Genealogical Society.

STEPHENSON, Henry Clay s/o G. & E.A. died 10 Oct 1854 aged 13 y 5 m

STEPHENSON, Fredonia M. d/o G. & E. died 13 July 1868 aged 20 y 4 m 10

THOMPSON, Eliza J. w/o R.L., d/o N. & E. Blue. Died 3 Mar 1857 aged 45 y 1 m2 da Footstone EJT

BLUE, Neil died Dec 20, 1851

BLUE, Sarah d/o N. & E. died 3 Jan 1840 aged 38 y 4 m 9 da

BLUE, John J.M. died Aug. 1, 1846 aged 26 y 2 m 11 da

SLAUGHTER, John died 18 Jan 1870 aged 63 y 6 m 1 da

STEPHENSON, Effiah Ann w/o Garret Stephenson, died 25 Feb 1882 aged 72 y 10 m 17 da

DAVENPORT, Catherine E. d/o S.R. & born 10 Dec 1856 – 6 Apr 1857

MOSELEY, Arthur 17 Feb 1811 – 12 Sept 1869

BLUE, Elizabeth w/o Neil Blue died 11 Jan 1863 aged 83 y 1 m 12 da

Notes:

Arthur Moseley, interred at Blue Stephenson Cemetery, is believed to be the father of Betty Mosley, wife of John T. Dennison, citizen of Monroe County and notorious civil war bushwhacker. An account of the activities of John T. Dennison and his associates is given in Till #174 of the Audrain County Circuit Court records. File contains the record of his arrest and statement of James F. Lindsay, a captured bushwhacker of Monroe County, who married Triss Northcutt, a daughter of Thornton Northcutt of Audrain County. Names Capt. Samuel Murray, John Moseley, Reuben or Ben Canterbury Sr., Reuben Canterbury Jr., George Mosley, John Blue also known as Sawney Blue, William Campbell, William Uzzell, James Uzzell and others.

W.C. Bates married Caroline M. Blue Mar. 4, 1841 in Audrain County. Daniel Galbreath was married to Flora Blue. Buried in Galbreath Cemetery
