

Center of south half of Sec. 15, T51N, R9W $\frac{1}{4}$ mi north of city limits on county Rd. #306 then $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north on County Rd. #314. Cemetery on west side of road is destroyed. Many burials here but no markers remain. This information on known burials compiled by A.E. Gallagher and Geraldine Miller.
