

Old Martinsburg, Crigler or Confederate Cemetery



Old Martinsburg cemetery, Crigler cemetery, or Confederate cemetery. This is confirmed by Paul Hoer, who has much information about the Martinsburg area. This cemetery is located in the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of sec. 24, T50N, R7W on the east side of Co. Rd. 751, south of Martinsburg city limits. The cemetery is indicated on the 1918 atlas.

Crigler, Susan A. dau. of J.W. & E. Crigler. died 23 Oct. 1871 aged 18 yrs. 5 mo. 14 da.

Davis, Alice N. wife of James M. Davis Died 12 Apr. 1871 aged 20 yrs. 3 mo. 7 da. Footstone: A.N.D.

Scott, Milton P. son of D. & N.M. Scott Ddied 1 Aug. 1871 aged 23 yrs. 8 mo. 15 da. Footstone: F.P.S.

The three ex-Confederates who were murdered by James Galloway, registering officer, at the voting polls on Sept. 3, 1868, were buried here. The remains of David F. Fletcher and Samuel Fletcher were exhumed in December 1888 and were re-interred in what is now Elmwood Cemetery. Their original headstones were placed at the new location. The headstone of Lt. Andrew Marshall can no longer be found but he is still buried in this cemetery. There are other burials here but no others have been identified.
